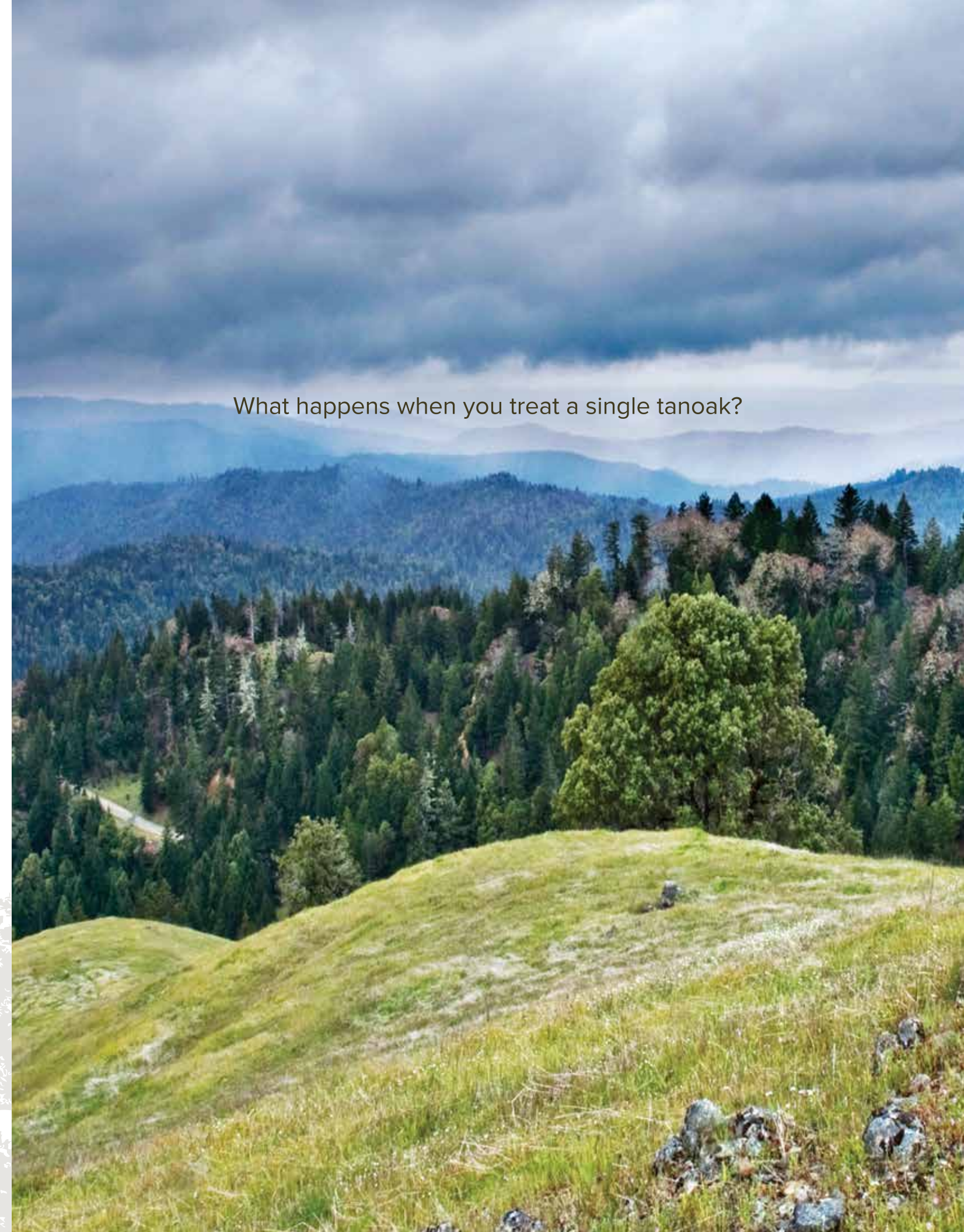

In the past few weeks, we've been working hard to initiate a discussion about Measure V.

Our point:

Measure V is a well-intentioned ballot proposition written by our neighbors. We have learned a lot from them and they have made us better.

But, on balance, it will do more harm than good.

Resulting in woodlands that now provide habitat for 14 million additional thriving redwood and Douglas fir trees.

Something that could never have happened with Measure V's permanent restrictions on tanoak treatment.

To put this into perspective, that means 1 tanoak treated by expert foresters, each one by hand.

And 14 immensely productive and sustainable redwood and Douglas fir trees gained.
